 2. One of his laments is recorded in Jeremiah 8:20.
 3. The stubbornness of Judah has secured an impending judgment.
 4. They’ve waited too long, and now there’s nothing they can do.
 5. Let’s consider a few applications from this expression, “Summer has ended and we are not saved.”

I. God Expects Sorrow For Sin

- A. I’m not talking about the kind of sorrow for getting caught in sin, but genuine sorrow for the sin, itself.
