 1. Our heavenly citizenship isn't contingent upon the nature or success of any worldly kingdom.
 2. Christianity can exist wherever it is planted.
 3. The decline and degradation of a nation does not affect my heavenly citizenship.
 4. The world has always been and will always be antagonistic toward Christianity.
 5. (2 Timothy 2:19).
