Introduction: 1.

- 1. The average American home has 3 television sets.
- 2. Television, good or bad, catches our attention.
- 3. So, I thought we would use the titles from several fictional television shows to springboard us into reality recorded for us in the Bible.
- 4. I also believe that the reality is every bit as much, and more informative, educational, and captivating than the fiction.
- 5. Tonight, we will examine "The Three Stooges."

I. Background to the Book of Job

- A. Job, a righteous man, experiences loss in such a way that is almost unimaginable (Job 1).
 - 1. Though Job questioned God throughout the book, he never lost faith.
 - 2. In fact, even though God allowed circumstances to befall him that caused him to pray for death, he still longed to be with God (Job 19:25-26).
- B. His family, his servants, his wealth, and his health are all taken from him.
- C. His friends hear of his calamity and come to mourn with him (2:11-13).
- D. After seven days, Job's friends finally speak and their words were foolish.

II. Why Job's Three Friends Were Stooges

- A. They Had an incorrect believe system.
 - 1. Eliphaz.
 - a. (Job 4:7-8).
 - b. We reap what we sow.
 - c. While he acknowledged a true principle (Galatians 6:7), he drew a faulty application from it.
 - 2. Bildad.
 - a. (Job 8:2-7).
 - b. If bad things happen to you, it's your own fault. You must be guilty of sin.
 - 3. Zophar.
 - a. (Job 11:13-15).
 - b. He too acknowledged a truth that sin needed to be repented of, but he drew a the faulty conclusion that Job had sinned.
- B. They falsely accused Job of wrong-doing.
- C. They were poor comforters.
- D. They misrepresented God.

Conclusion:

- 1. May we learn from Job's three friends, avoid their mistakes and walk in wisdom.
- 2. It's easy to dismiss what they said because of their mistakes, but remember the truths they expressed:
 - a. We do reap what we sow.
 - b. We do need to repent when we sin.
