

Sanctification Requires Separation

- Separation
 - "From" the world (2 Cor. 6:17-18).
 - "To" God (1 Pet. 2:9).
 - "For" his Glory (1 Cor. 10:31).
 - "By" the blood (Heb. 10:10, 29).

Sanctification Requires Consecration



- Consecration Denotes
 Commitment & Loyalty.
- (2 Cor. 8:4; Rev. 3:15-16).
- Sanctification requires more than simply not doing evil.
 - (Matthew 12:43-45).

Sanctification Requires Holiness

- Holiness
 - (1 Peter 1:16).
 - One will always struggle against sin (Rom. 7:13-25), but one who is sanctified will not allow sin to have dominion over him (Rom. 6:14).

Biblical Sanctification

is both a state and a process. (Rom. 6:19; 1 Thess. 5:23)
