The Man Who Saw The Invisible

(2 Kings 6:8-20)

Introduction: 1. It seems that in our Christian walk, when we are lost in fear, grief, and worry, God often appears.

- 2. Such happened to Elisha and one of his servants long ago.
- 3. Surrounded by an enemy army, Elisha stayed calm while Elisha's servant is greatly distressed.

I. The Story Unfolds

A. The Main Characters.

- 1. Ben-hadad (king of the Syria).
- 2. Jehoram (king of Israel).
- 3. Elisha (the man of God).
- 4. Two servants one belonging to Elisha and one belonging to Ben-hadad.

B. The Situation.

- 1. Elisha, by divine revelation, continually thwarts Ben-hadad's military aggressions against Israel.
- 2. Frustrated and angry, Ben-hadad wants to know who the traitor is.
- 3. Ben-hadad's servant tells him that Elisha is their problem, so the king sends an army to capture Elisha.

C. The Reaction.

- 1. Upon seeing the approaching army, Elisha's servant panics, while Elisha calmly says, "Do not fear."
- 2. Elisha was able to see God's spiritual protection, while his servant could only see their physical enemy.

D. The Result.

- 1. God blinds the army of Ben-hadad, and Elisha leads them into Samaria where they are surrounded.
- 2. The victory belongs to God.

II. Questions To Consider

- A. Do we sometimes allow intimidating odds and obstacles keep us from doing good?
- B. Are those who are on God's side ever really outnumbered?
- C. What about angels today? Do they serve to protect us?
- D. What are we to make of Elisha's lie he told the army of Ben-hadad?
- E. Would we be more courageous if we could focus in on the spiritual as well as we can the physical?
