- C. The sovereignty of God has been displaced by the sovereignty of the consumer.
- D. Christianity is being marketed, packaged, and sold to a secular consumer — However, to do so is to remove the offense of the cross – the message of the cross is a stone of stumbling and a rock of offense – it is disturbing, confrontive, and offensive to human pride.
- E. Compare “user friendly” with Ananias & Sapphira (Acts 5:1-11).
- F. (Acts 10:33) We are present before God.

- B. Much of the preaching one hears today consists of pop-psychology, felt needs, current events, and pleasant platitudes.
- C. Truth is dispensed in such small, watered down, diluted doses it lacks the power to convict sinners.
- D. “Longwindedness” has become a greater sin than heresy.
- E. It is not so much what is being said as it is what is not being said.
- F. (2 Chronicles 34:14-15) Book of the Lord lost in the house of God.
