“Manna: A Type Of Jesus”

(Exodus 16:11-30; John 6:49-51)

- Introduction:
1. As has already been stated throughout this series, the Old Law was a shadow of things to come (Hebrews 10:1).
 2. We have examined how the tabernacle and its furniture typified Christ and the church; the Noaic flood typified baptism; Noah’s ark typified the church; and how Moses typified Jesus.
 3. There are many such types scattered throughout the Old Testament.
 - a. Adam and Jesus (1 Corinthians 15:45-49).
 - b. Melchizedek and Jesus (Hebrews 5:6; 6:20-7:12).

Manna: A Type Of Jesus	
Manna (Exodus 16:11-30)	Jesus (John 6:49-51)
Manna was a physical temporal blessing (John 6:31,49)	Jesus is a spiritual and eternal blessing (John 6:48,51)
Manna was given by grace to Israel (John 6:31; Exodus 16:11-30)	Jesus was given by grace to all men (Hebrews 2:9; John 3:16)
Manna came from heaven (John 6:31)	Jesus came from heaven (John 6:38,62; 17:5)
Manna was as sweet as wafers & honey (Exodus 16:31)	Jesus gives life at its best (John 6:35; 10:10)
Manna was given by promise (Exodus 16:4)	Jesus was given by promise (Genesis 3:15; 12:3; Isaiah 7:14)
Manna was to be gathered and prepared (Exodus 16:16-23)	Jesus must be received through obedience (Matthew 7:21-23; Luke 6:46)
Manna gathered and not used, spoiled (Exodus 16:19-20)	Jesus, not appropriated will “spoil” us (Hebrews 10:24-31)
Manna was limited to Israel (John 6:31,49)	Jesus is for the whole world (John 3:16; 1 John 4:14)
