## **Did You Get What You Expected?**

(Luke 8:26-39)

- Introduction: 1. At this time of the year, we are well acquainted with giving and receiving gifts.
  - 2. Some of these gifts are received with great joy and excitement, while others are received not so enthusiastically.
  - 3. Likewise, when it comes to God's gifts, we often fail to appreciate the gifts he give us, because they aren't at all what we expected.
    - a. A Helpless Baby (Luke 2:1-20; John 1:1,14)?
    - b. A King who refused to be King (John 6:15)?
    - c. The Lord of Hosts who said to put your sword away (Mt. 26:52).
    - d. A Crucified Conqueror (John 19).
  - 4. He was not what we expected, but everything we needed.
  - 5. In today's lesson, we'll examine how people typically respond to the "gift of Jesus."

## I. The Setting

- A. Jesus had come to the land of the Gadarenes (Luke 8:26).
- B. There he met a demon possessed man (Luke 8:27-28).
- C. Jesus cast the demons out of him (Luke 8:29-33).
- D. The people respond to what Jesus did (Luke 8:34-39).

## II. The Responses to Jesus

- A. Some ran from him
  - 1. (Luke 8:34).
  - 2. There are people who want nothing at all to do with Jesus.
  - 3. Their response of flight is not even tempered by curiosity.
- B. Some asked him to leave.
  - 1. (Luke 8:37).
  - 2. The presence of Jesus can be a threat to what we know, the way we do things, and might be costly.
- C. One begged to go with him.
  - 1. (Luke 8:38).
  - 2. Though he did not go with Jesus; Jesus gave him a mission to spread the word about what great things God had done and that he did!

## Conclusion:

- 1. God has given us a gift, one that none of us would have guessed before it was "unwrapped."
- 2. And maybe we haven't made up our minds just what to do with this gift.
- 3. My advice to you is to put aside all your preconceived notions and beliefs, embrace it, and proclaim to all what great things God has done for you.
