(2 Peter 3:1-18)

- Introduction: 1. Last week, September 23, David Meade had predicted that the world would end.
  - a. When the 23<sup>rd</sup> came and went, Meade postponed his doomsday prediction till October 15.
  - 2. Setting dates and predicting the time of the end is nothing new.
    - a. (2 Thessalonians 2:2-3).
    - b. (2 Timothy 2:17-18).
  - 3. But as the years pass, skepticism increases.
    - a. That was true in the first century and even more today.
    - b. False predictions increase such skepticism and cause disillusionment.
    - c. And while some are not openly skeptics, they are by their actions.
  - 4. Let's learn what the Bible says about Jesus' return and the end of the world
