You're In The Army Now

(1 Samuel 24 - 2 Samuel 5)

Introduction: 1. I want you to use your imagination tonight.

- 2. I want you to imagine that you are a soldier in David's army.
- 3. Now that you're enlisted, I want you to consider what your thoughts and actions might have been as you considered the thoughts and actions of your leader, David.

I. Background

- A. Ever since David's victory over Goliath, Saul has been jealous (1 Sam. 17).
- B. In fact, this jealousy has turned to rage and Saul has attempted to kill David (1 Sam. 18).
- C. Saul has doggedly pursued David, and even used David's wife as a pawn in attempting to capture him.
- D. David is pushed to the point of actually forming an alliance with the Philistines (1 Sam. 27).
- E. It's because of actions like this, you find your leader an enigma.
 - 1. Anointed, heart was right, praised by the people, loved by his king, possessed the Spirit of God, and was confident in the Lord.
 - 2. Suspicious, conspiracy, insanity, murder, hunted, treachery, duplicity, and foreign alliance.

II. David's Actions

- A. David twice spared Saul's life.
 - 1. (1 Sam. 24) in a cave.
 - 2. (1 Sam. 26) sleeping.
 - 3. David demonstrated his respect for God's anointed.
- B. David gives spoils to his nation, the people of God.
 - 1. (1 Sam. 30:26-31).
 - 2. David demonstrated his love for God's people.
- C. David and the Amalekite (2 Sam. 1).
 - 1. An Amalekite returns with a story of Saul's death.
 - 2. David requires this man's life, rather than rewarding him.
 - 3. The "Song of the Bow."
- D. Abner & Ishbosheth
 - 1. (2 Samuel 2-4).
 - 2. David is a man of honor and not consumed with self promotion.

III. Application: As Soldiers of David, We Learned...

- A. There's more to life than victory over the enemy.
- B. God's positions demand respect even when the man doesn't deserve it.
- C. We're learning to keep our mouth shut.
- D. How to love even our enemies.
