## **Joseph**

(Genesis 37-50)

# Introduction: 1. People sometimes ask how you can keep preaching from becoming boring because you tell the same stories over and over again.

- 2. Well, the Bible is an inexhaustible supply of truths waiting to be applied.
- 3. And by telling a familiar story from a different angle or perspective, you see an entire new application.
- 4. Such is the case with the story of Joseph.
- 5. This morning, I want us to consider an application that is seldom addressed with examining this story.

#### I. Background

- A. Joseph is a favored son of Jacob and his brothers hate him because of it (Gen. 37:4).
- B. Consequently, his brothers sell him into slavery (Gen. 37:19-28).
- C. Once sold into slavery, Joseph is later imprisoned (Gen. 38:20).
- D. While in prison, Joseph interprets the King's dream and is elevated to "Second-in-Command in Egypt (Gen. 41:40).
- E. Once in command, Joseph is reunited with his brothers (Gen. 42:6-7).
- F. Joseph then brings his father and brothers and their families to live with them in Goshen (Gen. 47:5-6).

### II. Lessons From This Account

- A. The typical lessons from this account are lessons on:
  - 1. Providence.
  - 2. Faithfulness.
  - 3. Forgiveness.
- B. However the lesson I want to learn from this account today comes from a statement made in Genesis 44:16 and Genesis 42:21-22.
- C. "God has found out the iniquity of your servants..."
  - 1. These brothers could not escape their guilt!
  - 2. Their guilt robbed them of peace with God (Psalm 32:1-2).
  - 3. Their guilt robbed them of peace within (Psalm 32:3-4).
  - 4. Their guilt was released when they finally confessed (Psalm 32:5).
