I. God Can Use Us In Suffering

- A. (Psalm 119:71) It was good for me to be afflicted...
- B. Good Grief?
- C. (Exodus 14).
- D. (John 11:4) The suffering was allowed for the greater good of glorifying God.
- E. Don't confuse the journey with the destination.

II. God's Time Is Not Our Time

- A. God sees the end from the beginning (Isaiah 46:10) and is thus able to act at just the right times.
- B. (Galatians 4:4).
- C. The delay would not be what we would chose, but it was perfect to accomplish his purpose.

III. Don't Judge A Man By A Momentary Weakness

- A. (John 11:16).
- B. (John 20:20, 24-29; Mark 16:14).
- C. Practice the Golden Rule (Matthew 7:12).

IV. Jesus Wept

- A. (John 11:35) Jesus is full of love and compassion.
- B. (Hebrews 4:15).
- C. Jesus wept because of the hurt in Mary and Martha, not because of the death of Lazarus.

V. Jesus Desires Cooperation

- A. (John 11:39) Told them to roll away the stone.
- B. The one who could raise the dead asked others to roll away the stone.
- C. God also requires cooperation in our salvation.

VI. Guard Your Heart

- A. (John 11:45-53).
- B. (Hebrews 3:13-15).
- C. (Ephesians 4:19; 1 Timothy 4:2).

Conclusion: 1. May the these lessons from Lazarus teach us to have greater trust in the God we serve.
