Major Profit from Minor Prophets

(Joel)

Introduction:

- 1. If you're interested in Jesus, you should be interested in the prophets.
- 2. Revelation 19:10 says that the spirit of prophecy is the testimony of Jesus.
- 3. (Luke 24:44) Jesus said that all that had been written of him in the Law, the Psalms, and Prophets must be fulfilled.
- 4. The prophets were great and godly men; men who could not be silenced by bribery or threat.
- 5. (Matthew 16:13-15) What a great compliment to the prophets!

I. Brief Background to the book of Joel

- A. Joel is a pre-exilic prophet.
- B. It was written to the southern kingdom of Judah.
- C. Joel warns of an impending judgment of God upon Judah, but also shares the good news of God's eventual blessing.
- D. The message of the prophets was often a mixture of God's judgment and his blessing; bad news and good news.
- E. This is precisely what we see in the book of Joel.

II. Practical Lessons to Learn from Joel

- A. The Day of the Lord.
 - 1. Was the plague of locusts an nature event or a divine judgment (Joel 1:4)?
 - 2. (Joel 1:15; 2:1,11,31; 3:14).
 - 3. God rules in the kingdoms of men (Daniel 4:17; 5:21).
- B. Pass On to the Next Generation.
 - 1. (Joel 1:2-3).
 - 2. (Deuteronomy 6:4-9).
 - 3. (Judges 2:10).
 - 4. (Ephesians 6:4).
- C. Make Intercession in Prayer.
 - 1. (Joel 1:14-15; 2:14).
 - 2. (James 5:16).
- D. Rend Your Heart and Not Your Garments.
 - 1. (Joel 2:13).
 - 2. (2 Corinthians 7:10).
- E. The Prophet of Pentecost.
 - 1. (Joel 2:28-29).
 - 2. Consider how Isaiah 2, Daniel 2, Joel 2 are fulfilled in Acts 2.
 - 3. Consider also all the specific details that were revealed 800 years before their fulfillment!
- F. The Valley of Decision.
 - 1. (Joel 3:14).
 - 2. (Joshua 24:15).
 - 3. (Revelation 22:17).

Conclusion:

- 1. Like the children of God in the days of Joel, we too stand in the "valley of decision."
- 2. Will we refuse to acknowledge God in our lives and fail to realize our accountability to him?
- 3. Or will we rend our hearts, and not just our garments? The decision is yours.
