# Are You Willing To Pay The Price?

(Luke 19:1-10)

- Introduction: 1. There is a price to pay if you wish to be a disciple of Jesus.
  - 2. Jesus explicitly stated that in (Luke 14:25-33).
  - 3. In Luke 19, we have an example of a man who was willing to pay a price to become a disciple of Jesus.
  - 4. Let's look at the price he paid, and ask ourselves if we would be willing to pay the same price.

## I. The Price to See Jesus - What Others Might Think

- A. (Luke 19:1-4).
- B. Are you willing to be ridiculed for the cause of Jesus?
- C. Think of what the people must have been thinking and even verbalizing.
- D. (John 15:18-21).
- E. (Acts 2:13).
- F. (2 Peter 3:3).

### II. The Price to Host Jesus - Personal Inconvenience

- A. (Luke 19:5-7).
- B. Jesus invited himself to Zacchaeus' house.
- C. Wonder if Zacchaeus expected that?
- D. What about his wife?
- E. But notice his attitude (Luke 19:6) He received him joyfully.
- F. Doing the right thing must be coupled with the right attitude.
  - 1. (1 Cor. 13:1-3).
  - 2. (2 Corinthians 9:7).

## III. The Price to Follow Jesus - Moral Demands on my Life

- A. (Luke 19:8-10).
- B. He gave half his goods to the poor He was a benevolent man.
- C. He restored four times what he might have defrauded from others.
  - 1. The Law demanded a restitution of one-fifth (Numbers 5:7).
  - 2. Example: If he stole \$100.00, the law demanded restitution of \$120.00, but Zacchaeus would restore \$400.00.
- D. Are we willing to pay the price and live morally?
- E. (Romans 12:9).
