 - 1. Expresses his hope (vs. 7-8)
 - 2. And he remembers people in his life (vs. 9-16).

II. The People In Paul's Life

- A. Demas, who had forsaken him (2 Timothy 4:10).
 - 1. (Matthew 13:3-6).
 - 2. Sadly, some will chose this world over the next world.
- B. Luke, who had remained with Paul (2 Timothy 4:11).
 - 1. Think of how much this must have meant to Paul.
 - 2. (Proverbs 18:24).
- C. John Mark, who had come into Paul's life, left, and came again (2 Timothy 4:11).
 - 1. (Acts 12:25; 13:13; 15:36-41).
 - 2. We have enough real enemies than to make our friends into our enemies.
- D. Alexander the Coppersmith who opposed Paul (2 Timothy 4:14).
 - 1. We will have people who are set on our destruction and harm.
 - 2. Sometimes, we must leave our grievances to God.
 - 3. (Nehemiah 6:2).
- E. God, who stood with him (2 Timothy 4:17-18).
 - 1. Regardless of what man may do; come or go, God will never forsake the faithful.

 - 2. May we pull close and forgive those who are not our enemies.
 - 2. And may we glorify God for being faithful to us.
