- Introduction: 1. Jesus was crucified, was dead, and lying in a tomb on Saturday.
 - 2. For the disciples of Jesus, this was earth-shaking.
 - They couldn't go back; their teacher was dead; their relationship had come to an abrupt and violent end; their dreams were shattered; they were confused; and their future was unknown.
 - 4. They had been pushed to the edge, and all we hear from God on this Saturday was silence.
 - 5. Although these events transpired 2000 years ago, have we not been where our early brothers and sisters were?
 - 6. We too have been pushed to the edge; hurt by the past; terrified by the future; and we sit in silence waiting for clarity.
 - 7. In this lesson, I want to share a few suggestions from God's word concerning what we need to do when we experience the "silence of Saturday."

I. Wait On God

- C. Being uncomfortable isn't always bad, and being confused doesn't always need immediate clarity.

III. Remember God's Promises

- A. (Luke 24:13-35).
- B. (Romans 8:28).
- C. (Hebrews 13:5).
