- D. (Matthew 7:13-14) Few saved in comparison to many lost.

II. Do **You** Want...

- A. Salvation is a personal matter.
- B. (2 Corinthians 5:10) Each of us will stand before God.
- C. Your desire for salvation must be personal.
 - 1. You can't obey to please spouse, get a job, or for acceptance.
 - 2. (Romans 6:17) Obedience from the heart.

III. Do You Want To **Be Made** Well?

- A. Salvation is not something that we earn or merit.
- B. We are passive in instigating the salvation process (Romans 5:6-8).
- C. (Titus 3:4-5).
- D. Christ paid the price of our sins on the cross a price too great for us to pay.
- E. (Psalm 49:6-8) No mere man can redeem a soul.

IV. Do You Want To Be Made Well?

- A. (Isaiah 1:18) Come let us reason together...
- B. (Romans 6:23) Wages of sin is death.
