One of the Greatest Compliments God Ever Gave to a Man

(Numbers 14:24)

- Introduction: 1. There are a lot of ways in which we are complimented.
 - 2. Sometimes, we're not sure if a compliment is a compliment or a backhanded insult.
 - 3. But God gives a great compliment to Caleb; one that can't be improved.
 - 4. God simply said of Caleb that he had a "different spirit" in him.
 - 5. Let's consider what it means to have a different spirit within us.

I. His Spirit Caused Him To Act Promptly To Obey God

- A. (Numbers 13:30).
- B. Having a "different spirit" will cause us to act immediately on what we learn, when we learn it.
- C. Don't delay for a "more convenient season."

II. His Spirit Caused Him To Obey When Others Weren't

- A. (Numbers 13:31).
- B. It's hard to take a stand, to do right, when everyone else is doing otherwise.
- C. Having a "different spirit" expresses itself in having more concern about what God thinks of you than what your peers think of you.

III. His Spirit Caused Him To Obey When He Didn't Fully Understand

- A. (Numbers 13:32-33; 14:8-9).
- B. Caleb didn't deny the report concerning the Canaanites, nor did he know how God would deliver these fortified cities into their hands, but he trusted God.
- C. Having a "different spirit" causes us to trust God even when we don't understand how he will resolve some of our questions and concerns.

IV. His Spirit Caused Him To Volunteer

- A. (Joshua 14:6-14).
- B. Caleb asked for the mountainous land in which dwelt the giants.
- C. He knew enough about God that God would be with him.
- D. Having a "different spirit" doesn't allow you to shrink for hard work and sacrifice.

Conclusion: 1. What an honor for God to single out Caleb and take note that he had a "different spirit" that caused him to fully follow the Lord.

- 2. Based on what we saw in the life of Caleb, do you have a "different spirit," a spirit of obedience?
- 3. If not, commit yourself to developing that same spirit in our lives.
