Introduction: 1. Can an "All-Good," "All-Knowing," and All-Powerful" God exist?

- 2. Why does God allow His children to be placed in troubling situations; dilemmas that make us uncomfortable and often threaten to drive us to despair?
- 2. (Habakkuk 1:2; Job 3:11-26).
- 3. Let's see if we can come to some answers to this question by examining an Old Testament example.

I. God's Plan

- A. (Exodus 14:1-4).
- B. God's plan was not to lead them to safety, at least not right away.
- C. The reason: (v.4) so God could be glorified.

II. God's Patience

- A. (Exodus 14:10-12).
- B. They reacted in two ways.
 - 1. They looked up.
 - 2. And they lashed out.
- C. Notice the example of Jesus while suffering (1 Peter 2:21).

III. God's Protection

- A. (Exodus 14:13-30).
- B. God was busy working on their behalf.
- C. Remember, the Red Sea opened and closed at God's command, not at the command of the people.
- E. Also remember that deliverance may not be temporal but eternal.
 - 1. (Daniel 3:17-18).
 - 2. (Hebrews 11:8-10).

IV. God's Purpose

- A. (Exodus 14:31).
- B. Their difficulty brought them to reverence and belief in God.
- C. (Psalm 119:67,71).

Conclusion: 1. We will all have our "Red Sea Experiences".

- 2. This account was not simply written for our amazement, but for our instruction.
- 3. May we learn from this account to glorify God in difficult times and may we allow those difficult times to be times when our faith is strengthened, and it becomes a testimony to those about us.
