Lost In The Credits

Ittai

(2 Samuel 15:18-22)

- Introduction: 1. Not many people would recognize the name, "Ittai."
 - 2. Yet, while he had a "minor" role in the biblical narrative, there are challenging lessons to glean from his brief "on screen appearance."

I. Background & Historical Setting

- A. Absalom is setting the stage to rebel against his father (2 Samuel 15:6).
- B. Through his manipulation, he won the hearts of the people and King David had to flee for his life.
- C. As he was fleeing, we are introduced to a man by the name of Ittai.
- D. Ittai was a Gittite a person from the Philistine city of Gath.
- E. He had migrated to Jerusalem, just the day before.
- F. David tried to get him to stay in Jerusalem basically saying, "This isn't your fight."
- G. But Ittai was ready to follow David wherever he led them.
- H. David promoted Ittai to a trusted captain (2 Samuel 18:2).

II. Practical Lessons

- A. Don't judge a man by where he's from.
 - 1. Ittai was from Gath, a Philistine city, the home of Goliath.
 - 2. Jesus was dismissed by such a standard (John 7:45-52).
 - a. No prophet has arisen out of Galilee.
 - b. They were wrong about this (2 Kings 14:25).
 - 3. Can any good thing come out of Nazareth (John 1:46).
 - 4. We tend to "size people up" by background, skin color, nation, education, etc.
 - 5. God's grace is greater than our sin (1 Timothy 1:12-16).
- B. You didn't have to be a Jew to be a believer.
 - 1. (2 Samuel 15:21) Ittai makes an oath involving God Jehovah.
 - 2. God was interested in the nations.
 - 3. He loved all people, not just the Jews.
 - 4. It's easier for some people to come to faith than others. Those who "worked" for it, often have a greater degree of loyalty.
- C. Loyalty can be costly.
 - 1. (2 Samuel 15:19-21).
 - 2. Lose your job (John 12:42; Acts 18:8; 1 Corinthians 1:1).
 - 3. Lose a friend (Galatians 2:14 Paul & Peter; Galatians 4:16).
 - 4. Lose your life (Mark 6:14-29 John the Baptist).
 - 5. He gave up his ease they were on the road again!
 - 6. He recognized some things are more important than life, itself.
- D. Family came second.
 - 1. (2 Samuel 15:21-22).
 - 2. He had little ones among his number.
 - 3. So many people put family before the Lord.
