Overshadowed Truths

(2 Timothy 2:15)

Introduction:

- Sometimes it is possible that something of great value is within our grasp, but we fail to realize it because we are distracted by something else.
- 2. Such is also the case with reference to God's word.
- 3. Sometimes, we address certain passages in a way that we miss truths of great value.
- 4. In this lesson, we will examine three such passages.

I. The Thief on the Cross

1.

- A. (Luke 23:26-43).
- B. What comes to mind when I say, "The thief on the cross?"
- C. For many, it's a debate about the necessity of baptism.
- D. However, do you think that within the context of this passage, that was the intent of the passage?
- E. Was this passage intended to be a "puzzle piece" in a debate about baptism?
- F. Rather, would you not agree that the thief on the cross is a lesson about the scope of God's love?
- G. From this passage, I learn of the depth and scope of God's love and it gives me hope!

II. Jesus Turning Water to Wine

- A. (John 2:1-12).
- B. Frequently, when we speak of this passage, it leads to an argument about the nature of the "wine" Jesus made and shared with the wedding guests.
- C. However, do you think this passage was preserved for us to provide us with leverage in a debate as to whether we should or should not drink alcohol?
- D. Instead, do you think this passage is recorded to provide evidence that Jesus was indeed, the Son of God?
- E. This was the first of many proofs that would validate his claims.
- F. Furthermore, we should be amazed by the power of God.

III. The Divine Longsuffering of God

- A. (1 Peter 3:18-21).
- B. Again, frequently this passage leads to a discussion as to when and how Jesus preached to "spirits in prison."
- C. But in our attempt to explain this passage, we overlook this powerful statement about the "divine longsuffering."
- D. Think how patient God was with a people whose every thought and imagination was wicked continuously!
- E. Such longsuffering gives me hope and assurance that God hasn't given up on me.

Conclusion:

- 1. May we give greater care to read and meditate upon the word of God.
- 2. Countless rich and comforting truths are awaiting to be discovered.
