- b. Failed in school achieved a deficiency.
- c. A career change opportunity you're fired.
- d. Surrounded in a target rich environment.
- 2. In Acts 17, Paul was in a "target rich environment."
- 3. And quite frankly we find ourselves dispersed among people who don't embrace our values or our Lord.
- 4. So, how should we respond?

I. Our Spirit's Should Be Provoked

- A. (Acts 17:16).
- B. Provoked, doesn't imply anger, but the word means to be stirred (Heb. 10:24).
- C. Don't grow accustomed to the world (Romans 12:2).
- D. Don't allow yourself to be desensitized to immorality.
- E. Be able to blush (Jeremiah 6:15).

II. We Must Be Provoked Enough To Speak

- A. (Acts 17:17).
- B. We cannot remain silent (2 Kings 7:9).
- C. (2 Corinthians 4:13) We believe, therefore we speak.
- D. How we speak, the forum or medium we use doesn't matter speak!
- E. (1 Corinthians 15:34).

III. Speak Kindly, But Pointedly

- A. (Acts 17:22-31).
- B. Consider Paul's kind, but pointed speech.
 - 1. You're religious but that's not good enough (Acts 17:22).
 - 2. You're zealous but your ignorant (Acts 17:23).
 - 3. In the past, men got a "pass" today, they face judgment (Acts 17:30-31).

IV. Be Content With Your Faithfulness

- A. (Acts 17:32-34).
- B. I know we would love to have success, but we must learn to be content to faithfulness (2 Corinthians 4:2-3).
- C. We plant and water, God gives the increase (1 Corinthians 3:6).
