My "Achan" Heart

(Joshua 7:1-26)

Introduction: 1. Are you really the person you want us to believe you are?

- 2. Are you deep down in your heart, the person everyone sees?
- 3. Not everyone has had a true heart.
 - a. Caleb followed the Lord wholly (Numbers 33:12)
 - b. Solomon did not follow the Lord with his whole heart (1 Kings 11:4).
- 4. In this lesson, I want us to examine our hearts to make sure we don't have an "Achan" heart.

I. The Background to the Text

- A. (Joshua 6).
- B. The children of Israel had just been given a great victory over Jericho.
- C. It was apparent to all that God was with them.
- D. However, they were defeated at Ai, and this defeat left them confused until the Lord revealed there was sin in the camp.
- E. Achan and his complicit family were guilty of stealing and disobeying God.

II. What We Learn from the Text

- A. My Sin is Known.
 - 1. (Joshua 7:11).
 - 2. We may partially hide our sins, but we cannot hide them from God.
- B. My Sin Hurts Others.
 - 1. (Joshua 7:1-9).
 - 2. Think of how our sins can hurt others.
- C. My Sin Must Be Addressed.
 - 1. (Joshua 7:12-26).
 - 2. Any organization must have discipline to succeed.
- D. My Sin, Once Addressed, Leads to Victory.
 - 1. (Joshua 8:1-35).
 - 2. Though repentance is painful, embarrassing, and humbling, it leads to our victory over sin.
- Conclusion: 1. Are you who you who you want others to believe you are?
 - 2. Of what value is it to fool those around you if you cannot fool God.
 - 3. Stop pretending, get rid of your "Achan" heart, and give your heart wholly to God.
