Bearing Fruit

(Luke 13:6-9)

Introduction: 1. Christians must bear fruit if we expect to be acceptable to God.

- 2. But sometimes, I think we have a very narrow scope of what it means to "bear fruit."
- 3. This narrow vision has caused some to feel barren and unproductive.
- 4. The intent of this lesson is to demonstrate that we need to bear fruit and that we may be bearing more fruit than we have realized.

Conclusion:

- 1. The scope of bearing fruit is much broader than replicating disciples.
- 2. God is a God of small things (Haggai 2:3; Zechariah 4:10).
- 3. While bearing fruit is easier than maybe we thought, it is not accidental; it requires selflessness (John 12:24).
