Being a Christian

(1 Thessalonians 2:1-12)

Introduction: 1. The Bible is not just a book of rules and regulations, but it is also a very practical guide teaching us how to "do life."

- 2. People have varied ideas about what it means to be a Christian.
- 3. Christianity cannot be adequately defined by simply listing the things from which a Christian abstains, but must also include a listing of the things in which he engages.
- 4. In this lesson, what it means to be a Christian as seen in the life of Paul.

I. Be Biblical

- A. (1 Thessalonians 2:1-4).
- B. Speak the truth, even in conflict (Acts 16:22-24).
- C. The need for boldness (Acts 4:29).
- D. Our aim should be to please God, not the crowds.

II. Be Authentic

- A. (1 Thessalonians 2:5-6).
- B. They weren't trying to manipulate people (Jude 16) or make profit through godliness (1 Timothy 6:5).
- C. Paul was sincere.

III. Be Gracious

- A. (1 Thessalonians 2:7-11).
- B. Notice the terms...gentle, cherish, children, affection, dear, mother, father...
- C. Paul was bold and spoke the truth, but he did so with graciousness (Eph. 4:15).

IV. Be Relevant

- A. (1 Thessalonians 2:12).
- B. His preaching was intended to help them live a worthy life before God.
- C. Preaching that isn't practical or has no application is not helpful.

Conclusion: 1. In my estimation, Paul was one of the greatest Christians who has ever lived.

- 2. In this short section of Scripture, Paul reveals some challenging characteristics about his life that would help me to be a better Christian.
- 3. Let's all work to be more biblical, authentic, gracious, and relevant.
