Aids to Truth: Being Genuine & Consistent

(Romans 2:1,4))

- Introduction: 1. Ills. of preacher who lived a double life.
 - 2. (Romans 2:1,24).
 - 3. Haven't we all been "put off" by someone who holds the truth, but does so with arrogance and hypocrisy?
 - a. Ills. of preacher smoking a pipe.
 - 4. In order for us to be successful in reaching the lost, we must not only have truth, but we must speak it and handle it in love (Eph. 4:15).
 - 5. (1 Timothy 4:16) Take heed to self and doctrine.
 - 6. (Titus 2:7) Hold the truth with integrity.
 - 7. Let's explore a few qualities we must possess that must accompany our words.

I. We Need Kindness & Compassion

- A. We have probably all heard people stand for the truth and wonder if they loved the people they were teaching.
- B. Social media has contributed to some of the meanest, sarcastic, and vitriolic speech I've ever heard.
- C. (Prov. 15:1; Eph. 4:29; Col. 4:6).
- D. Don't appeal to Jesus in an attempt to justify hate speech.
 - 1. Jesus could be very pointed (Matthew 23:23,24,33).
 - 2. Jesus knew their hearts (Mark 2:8; Luke 6:8).
 - 3. We don't (1 Cor. 2:11), so love demands we think the best (1 Cor. 13:7).
- E. Ills. of debate between two brothers. The one with truth lost because of attitude.
- F. You can laugh or make light of that which you preach and stand against.
 - 1. Sin is no laughing matter.
 - 2. When you make light of sin, any sin, you are hurting someone.
 - 3. (Romans 12:9) Abhor that which is evil.
- G. We must stop looking past the person with whom we are speaking.
 - 1. Our goal is not to win an argument.
 - 2. Our goal is to save a soul.

II. We Need Discrimination

- A. How many times have you heard, "A sin is a sin."
- B. That is patently false!
 - 1. (John 19:31; Matthew 12:31-32; 1 John 5:16).
- C. If I fail to discriminate and treat all people the same, then I will most certainly drive people away from me.
 - 1. Ills. of the little boy getting water for his dad.
 - 2. Ills of engaged couple and a sexual predator.

- 2. Ills. the recovering alcoholic and the non-repentant alcoholic.
- D. Failure to see a distinction will run these people away from us.
- E. While discrimination requires greater effort, it's the only way to treat people fairly.
- F. (Matthew 7:12) The Golden Rule.

III. We Need Consistency

- A. The lack of consistency turns people off.
- B. If we demand repentance from others, but offer excuses for our own family, we lose our integrity and moral authority.
- C. Ills. Elders wanting to discipline but unwilling to repent.
