## I. He Had The Wrong View Jesus

- A. He called Jesus, "Good Teacher" (Matthew 19:16).
- B. Jesus is far more than a good teacher, and in fact, attempted to help this man see this truth, by saying, "No one is good but God" (Matthew 19:17).
- C. Jesus is more than a "good teacher," he's the Son of God.
