 2. However, the Bible is silent about many other questions we have.
 3. We must remember that the Bible was not written to satisfy our curiosity but was written to furnish us unto every good work (2 Timothy 3:16-17).
 4. Consider questions asked by others before us.
 - a. (Habakkuk 1:12-13).
 - b. (Job 7:20; 38:1-3).
 5. Let us consider some common questions people ask today.
