What If Jesus Wrote This Church A Letter?

Thyatira: The Corrupt Church

(Revelation 2:18-29)

Introduction: 1.

- 1. God's call for the church is to be a pure and holy people.
- 2. It has never been the mission of the church to redeem our secular culture, bring an end to poverty, or maximize the church's political clout.
- 3. Instead, God taught his church how to confront and deal with sin.
 - a. (Matt. 18:15-18; 1 Corinthians 5; Ephesians 5:25-27).
- 4. The letter to Thyatira denotes a change in tone.
- 5. Let's see what Jesus said.

I. Background to the Text

- A. The church at Thyatira was about 40 miles south of Pergama and was often overtaken by enemies.
- B. However, with the peace that Rome brought, Thyatira thrived.
- C. This city was known for its trade guilds (unions) and these trades had pagan deities they worshiped.
- D. Again, we don't know how the church was established here but (Acts 19:10; Acts 16:14) may have a bearing.

II. Jesus' Assessment

- A. Jesus Identifies Himself (Revelation 2:18).
- B. The Lord's Commendation (Revelation 2:19).
 - 1. Works, love, service, faith, and patience.
 - 2. However, we will see that doctrine and holiness matter (Heb. 12:14; 1 Tim. 4:16).
- C. The Lord's Condemnation (Revelation 2:20-23).
 - Their actions and the toleration of their actions are condemned (Rev. 2:20).
 - 2. Newsflash: God intends for his church to be known for their intolerance!
 - 3. The source of their problem seemed to be centered in a woman who claimed to be a prophetess and who was compared to Jezebel
 - a. Accommodating teaching trade guilds & pagan worship.
 - b. Gnosticism.
 - 4. Jesus will destroy them and demonstrate his power.
- D. The Lord's Comfort (Revelation 2:24-29).
 - 1. If you overcome, you will reign with me (Revelation 2:26-27).
 - 2. They will be given the morning star, who is Jesus (Revelation 22:16).

Conclusion:

- 2. May our love for truth be equaled by our hatred for error.
