(Psalm 107)

Introduction: 1. Of all people, of all time, we are most blessed.

- 2. Yet do we acknowledge our fullness and express our thanks?
- 3. (Philippians 4:6).
- 4. For the next few weeks, we will be considering reasons for which to be thankful, and how to express our gratitude.

I. Give Thanks for God's Goodness

- A. (Psalm 107:1,8,15,21,31).
- B. Do we take the goodness of God for granted?
 - 1. What if God were not a benevolent God?
 - What if God were antagonistic toward us?
- C. God is good...all the time.
 - 1. We hear these words when we succeed.
 - 2. Will we say these words during catastrophe?
 - 3. (Job 1:21).

II. Give Thanks for God's Mercy Endures Forever

- A. (Psalm 107:1).
- B. Have you ever felt as though you had exhausted or forfeited your right to salvation due to the severity or repetition of a sin?
- C. Give thanks, God's mercy endures forever (Psalm 136)!
- D. As long as the desire remains within you, you can come home (Luke 15:11-32).

III. Give Thanks for God's Redemption

- A. (Psalm 107:2).
- B. Redemption means "to buy back."
- C. We came at a high price to God (1 Corinthians 6:19-20).
- D. (John 3:16).
- E. It's not just my redemption, but the redemption of the people I love the most!

Conclusion:

- 1. Thankfulness and the lack thereof are more than just good manners.
- 2. Unthankfulness is listed among such sins as brutality, unholiness, and blasphemers.
- 3. Think to thank, and give God what is due and what is expected.
