What Does Faith Look Like?

(Hebrews 11:1)

Introduction: 1. The writer of Hebrews says that we cannot be pleasing to God unless we have faith.

- 2. We talk a lot about faith, we know it's necessary to have, but just what does it look like?
- 3. In this lesson, I want to put "skin" on faith so we can have a few concrete examples of what faith should look like in our lives.

I. Faith & the Ten Lepers

- A. (Luke 17:11-19).
- B. While this passage is primarily intended to teach a lesson about thanksgiving, there is a subtle lesson about faith, that is often overlooked.
- C. These lepers weren't healed until they went on their way.
 - 1. (Luke 17:14).
 - 2. (Leviticus 14:3).
- D. (2 Corinthians 5:17).
- E. Faith acted without seeing.

II. Faith & the Man Born Blind

- A. (John 9:1-34).
- B. Professing faith in Jesus was costly.
- C. This man's parents were unwilling to pay the price (John 9:20-22).
- D. The blind man was willing to suffer for his faith (John 9:34).
- E. Faith came at a cost.

III. Faith & The Demon Possessed Man

- A. (Mark 5:1-20).
- B. These demons had destroyed his life, his self-respect, his family relationships, and had made him a societal outcast.
- C. When this man saw what Jesus had done for him, he immediately wanted to become a disciple (Mark 5:18-20).
- D. Faith should create a sense of indebtedness.

Conclusion:

- 1. Hopefully, these examples will challenge us to strengthen our faith in Jesus.
- 2. Possibly our faith needs to grow in one or all three of these areas.
- 3. If so, pursue it with diligence (Hebrews 11:6).
