- Introduction: 1. Have you ever believed in something, only to learn that what you believed wasn't true?
 - 2. Who hasn't been fooled by at least some of these myths:
 - a. Your face will freeze that way.
 - b. Don't crack you knuckles; you'll get arthritis.
 - c. Your tongue has different taste sections.
 - d. Swallowing bubble gum takes 7 years to digest.
 - e. Blood is blue in the body but when it contacts oxygen it turns red.
 - f. Water is stored in a camel's hump.
 - g. Ostriches stick their heads in the ground when scared.
 - 3. All of these have been heard, and accepted as fact, but none of them are true. They're all myths.
 - 4. Could there be things in the Bible that we believe that are myths?

I. Myths Concerning the Birth of Jesus

- A. If there is any Bible story that nearly everyone is familiar with, it is the story of the birth of Jesus.
- B. Yet, that story it told and embraced with myths mingled throughout it.
- C. Examples:
 - 1. Gabriel appeared to Joseph to tell him to marry Mary.
 - 2. The star led the shepherds to the place of Jesus' birth.
 - 3. The number and timing of the wisemen.
 - 4. The perpetual virginity of Mary.

II. Myths Concerning Our Salvation

- A. Not all myths are inconsequential.
- B. Consider these myths that are commonly accepted.
 - 1. You don't have to be baptized (Acts 9:6; 22:16).
 - 2. The "sinner's prayer" (Acts 2:36-38; Acts 8:9-25).
 - 3. You can't fall from grace (Galatians 5:4).
 - 4. Everyone's going to heaven (Matthew 7:13-23).
 - 5. You have plenty of time (Luke 12:16-21; James 4:14).

Conclusion: 1. We're susceptible to being fooled by myths.

- 2. Let your susceptibility be a wake-up call to you, and make sure that you are not believing a myth about your own salvation.
