The Politics of Those Who Follow Jesus

(Romans 13:1)

Introduction: 1.

- It is a curious thing to me to find Christians who go door to door to promote a politician, but who would never do the same for Jesus; who are more vocal for their political party or candidate than they are for Jesus; and who are more committed to a political platform than they are the doctrine of Christ.
- 2. We are in the early stages of another political season in our country, so I thought it would be a good time to share a few reminders with you.
- 3. Let's consider what God's word says about government.

I. The Nature of Government

- A. (Romans 13:1-7).
- B. Government is appointed by God (Romans 13:1).
- C. Government is God's minister (Romans 12:4).
- D. Government is designed to restrain and punish evil-doers (Romans 13:3-4).
- E. Government is designed to protect the good (Romans 12:3-4).

II. Obligations We Have Toward Government

- A. We are to pray for them (1 Timothy 2:1-3).
- B. We are to pay them (Romans 13:6-7).
- C. We are to obey them (Romans 13:1-2).

III. What If Our Government Is Evil?

- A. How should a Christian act when mistreated by his government?
- B. (Acts 4:1-31).
 - 1. Peter and John were wrongly arrested (Acts 4:1-20).
 - 2. The actions of the government did not dissuade Peter and John from being faithful to their Lord (Acts 4:19).
 - 3. They prayed, but note that for which they prayed (Acts 4:29).

IV. Remember These Truths

- A. Our citizenship is in Heaven (Philippians 3:17-20).
- B. Obey God over man (Acts 5:29).
- C. Take courage in the truth that the Kingdom of God will never be overthrown (Daniel 2:44).
