Preaching Christ

(Acts 8:1-40)

Introduction:

- 1. In 1932, a brother in Christ wrote an article in which he said, that when Philip preached to the Eunuch, he "preached not a plan, but a man." (K.C. Moser, Preaching Christ).
- 2. Several years later, another brother wrote a book affirming that Jesus has faded from view within churches of Christ and replaced with the church and the plan of salvation (Bill Love, The Core Gospel).
- 3. These writing helped to give rise to, or at least parrot the idea that we should be preaching "Jesus," which is quite nebulous, and less about the teachings of Jesus.
- 4. While I believe we need to preach "Jesus" (the man), I do not believe we can do so without preaching the "plan."
- 5. In this lesson, let us establish what it means to preach Jesus.

I. Philip Preached Jesus to the Samaritans

- **A.** (Acts 8:5-12).
- B. Philip preached Christ to them.
- C. The text defines what that nebulous expression means.
 - 1. "Things concerning the kingdom"
 - a. Uniqueness (Ephesians 4:4).
 - b. Organization (Philippians 1:1).
 - c. Worship (John 4:24).
 - d. Work (Evangelism 1 Timothy 3:15; Benevolence James 1:27; Edification Romans 14:19).
 - 2. "The name of Christ"
 - a. (Matthew 28:18).
 - b. (Colossians 3:17).
 - 3. "Men and women were baptized"
 - a. The plan of salvation was included.
 - b. How else would he have known to be baptized?

II. Philip Preached Jesus to the Ethiopian Eunuch

- A. (Acts 8:35-37).
- B. Philip preached Jesus to the Ethiopian eunuch.
- C. What was the content of his sermon?
 - We don't know explicitly, but having just defined it for us, should give us some hints
 - 2. What we do know is that after Philip preached Jesus, the Ethiopian eunuch asked to be baptized.

Conclusion:

- 1. From what we have seen, preaching Jesus is more than a "nebulous" term.
- 2. When one affirms we need to preach the "Man and not the Plan," the Bible rebuts and affirms you can't preach the "Man without the Plan."
- 3. The Bible defines it as not only teaching about the person of Jesus, but also, the church, the plan of salvation, and judgment to come.
