What Would Be Your Weapon of Choice?

(Judges 6-8)

- Introduction: 1. The weapons of our warfare are foreshadowed in the historical narrative of Gideon's battle with the Midianites.
 - 2. We are in engaged in a warfare and need to be constantly reminded for one who wanders about aimlessly on a battlefield is bound to become a casualty of war (Ephesians 6:10-12).
 - 3. The purpose of this lesson is to remind us of the unusual nature of the weapons of our warfare.

I. The Trumpet — Heralding The Good News Of Salvation

- A. There is transforming power in the word of God (Romans 1:16; 1 Peter 2:22-23).
- B. The word of God will:
 - 1. Free (John 8:32).
 - 2. Sanctify (John 17:17).
 - 4. Enlighten (Psalm 119:130).
- C. (2 Timothy 4:1-4) The word needs to be preached at all times.
- D. The word of God will always triumph over the doctrines of the Devil in the sincere heart of a seeker of God's will.

II. The Pitcher — Service To Our Fellow Man

- A. Jesus was a servant and we are to follow His example (Matthew 20:25-28; Romans 8:29).
- B. As we have the opportunity, let us serve (Galatians 6:10; Proverbs 3:27).
- C. We are to maintain good works (Titus 3:8; Ephesians 2:8-10).
- D. Few things have as great an influence on others than to be willing to serve them.

III. The Torch — Our Godly Example

- A. We are to be lights unto the world (Matthew 5:14-16).
- B. We are instructed to be examples (1 Timothy 4:12).
- C. We will influence others good or bad (Romans 14:7).
- D. We should be the reflection of Jesus in the world today.

Conclusion: 1. The weapons of our warfare are indeed strange — but they are the weapons God has placed in our hands.

- 2. To doubt their effectiveness, is to doubt the power of God.
- 3. Pick up your trumpet, pitcher, and torch and engage the enemy in battle.
