- C. Matthew 23:3, 15, 33.
- D. Came to be known as pretentious, self-righteous and a term of derision.

II. Nicodemus B He Came To Christ

- A. (John 3:1).
- B. Why he came at night, nobody knows for sure.
 - 1. It may have been totally unrelated to his fear.
 - 2. It may have been because he was afraid (John 12:42-43).
- C. However, the very fact that he came to Jesus shows a great deal of humility.
- D. He also exhibited honesty (John 3:2).
- E. If one is to come to Christ today, he must possess humility and honesty.

III. Nicodemus B He Spoke For Christ

- A. (John 7:50-51).
- B. Do we have the courage to stand before our peers and speak out for Jesus?
- C. While we cannot speak for the person of Jesus as Nicodemus was able to do, we can speak for the words of Jesus.
 - 1. The Plan of Salvation.
 - 2. The Uniqueness of the church.
 - 3. The Worship of the church.
 - 4. Purity of life expected of Christians.
