- B. The people viewed John as a prophet of God (Mark 1:5).
- C. But John proclaimed Jesus to be the Messiah (John 1:29).

III. The Testimony of Jesus' Works

- A. (John 5:36).
- B. Only the hard-hearted could deny Jesus' claims after witnessing his miracles (Matthew 12:24).
- C. (Mark 2:10).

IV. The Testimony of the Father

- A. (John 5:37-38).
- B. The baptism of Jesus (Matthew 3:16).
- C. The transfiguration (Matthew 17:5).

V. The Testimony of Scripture

- A. (John 5:39-47).
- B. Old Testament Scripture prophesied of Jesus.
- C. The design of prophecy The testimony of Jesus is the spirit of prophecy (Revelation 19:10).
- D. (John 5:46; Luke 24:27).

Conclusion:
