II. Realize His Leading Doesn't Mean Our Comfort

- A. (Exodus 14:1-30).
- B. God led Noah but it meant building an ark (Genesis 6-8).
- C. God led Paul but it meant suffering (2 Corinthians 11:22-28).
- D. Following Jesus doesn't mean life will get easier.

III. His Leading Will Result in Our Good

- A. (Romans 8:28).
- B. He's a father that will only give us what we need.
- C. (Matthew 7:7-12).

IV. We Have a Choice Whether to Follow or Not

- A. Israel often rebelled, and sometimes we do too.
- B. In spite of our unfaithfulness, God hasn't given up on us (Hosea).
- C. God won't force any of us to follow him (Revelation 22:17).
