Face to Face

(1 Corinthians 13:12)

Introduction: 1. It's been a year since we've been able to see each other face to face due to Covid.

- 2. We've gone through several variations of masks.
- 3. It's been hard preaching to people with whom you cannot read their reactions.
- 4. But today, we are mask free and are able to see each other face to face.
- 5. That expression brings to mind a statement in 1 Corinthians 13:12 that I would like to consider today.

I. The Meaning of 1 Corinthians 13:12

- A. I would like to begin by telling you that this passage is not talking about how things will be in heaven.
- B. It's talking about how things are right now.
- C. Let me explain...
 - 1. This is written in the context of spiritual gifts.
 - 2. Prior to the completed revelation of God's word, they saw in a "mirror" dimly, but now that is will has been revealed, we see face to face.

II. The Application of 1 Corinthians 13:12

- A. When we look in a mirror, do we fix our flaws?
 - 1. (James 1:23-24).
 - 2. Do we care about our flaws? Try to cover them? Or stop looking in the mirror?
- B. When we look in a mirror, do we deflect by seeing others?
 - 1. (John 21:23) What's it to you?
 - 2. (2 Corinthians 5:10).
 - 3. (2 Corinthians 10:12).
- C. When we look in a mirror, do we see Jesus?
 - 1. (Romans 8:29).
 - 2. Are you looking more and more like Jesus?
 - 3. (Matthew 16:13-14) What a great compliment to be mistaken for Jesus!

Conclusion:

- 1. Friends, we can see ourselves "face to face" this today.
- 2. God's word provides a mirror for our souls.
- 3. My hope is that you look into this mirror and use it properly.
