(2 Peter 3:1-18)

- Introduction: 1. A little more than two thousand years ago, Jesus came to this earth in the form of a helpless baby.
 - 2. But Jesus didn't stay a baby, he became a man whose confrontation of sin caused others to kill him.
 - 3. But before Jesus left, he promised to come again.
 - 4. His second coming will be a day of joy and victory for the faithful child of God, but it will be a terrifying day for those who are unprepared.
 - 5. There are no signs are hints as to when he will come back, allowing people to "cram for a final;" his coming unannounced.
 - 6. But as the years pass, skepticism increases.
 - 7. If this was true in the first century, it is certainly true today, 2000 years later, and still no appearance of Jesus.
 - 8. What answer do we have for the skeptics and how do we keep our faith in his return unwavering?
 - 9. I believe the answer lies in 2 Peter 3.
