# Remember Lot's Wife

(Luke 17:32)

#### Introduction: 1. This is one of the shortest verses in the Bible.

- 2. This statement was spoken in the context of the impending destruction of Jerusalem.
- 3. In this sermon, let us learn why Jesus called our attention to this woman.

# I. Privileged Status Won't Save You from God's Judgment

- A. The Jews were God's people, yet they were about to be destroyed (Luke 17:20-37).
- B. Mrs. Lot was the niece of Abraham, the wife of Lot, but her relatives were not her salvation.
- C. Don't forget how God deals with people (Jude 5-7).
- D. Just because you are a Christian doesn't mean you can flaunt the commandments of God (Matthew 7:21).

# II. She Perished Although Warned To Flee

- A. It is not enough to know the facts of the gospel, we must obey them.
- B. (James 4:17).
- C. (James 1:22).
- D. It must be a horrifying fate to stand condemned while knowing all along the route to pardon.

#### III. She Perished Although Her Sin Seemed Small

- A. She just looked back.
- B. It seemed only natural; remember, her family was there.
- C. But this should stand to warn us of how serious sin is viewed by God.
- D. (Romans 6:23).

### IV. She Perished Although She Was Separated from Sodom

- A. Sodom can be viewed as a type of the world.
- B. Even though a person may leave the world and be translated into the kingdom of God (Colossians 1:13), they still can sin (I John 2:1).
- C. Probably more than we would like to realize, there are a number of Christians who are separated from the world but looking back.
- D. (Philippians 4:13-14).

#### Conclusion: 1.

- 1. The mistake of Lot's wife should serve as a warning to us all.
- 2. Initial separation from the world is good, but not sufficient.
- 3. We must guard our lives by continued obedience day by day.
- 4. "But Jesus said to him, no one, having put his hand to the plow, and looking back, is fit for the kingdom of God." (Luke 9:62).
