Swine or Savior?

(Mark 5:1-20)

Introduction: 1. Ills. of Let's Make a Deal – picking a curtain (Monte Hall, Wayne Brady)

- 2. The thing about this account in the life of Jesus that I find most amazing is not the demonstration of his power, but the reaction of the people.
- 3. Let's see if we can learn something from the people in the story.

I. The Despair of the Demon-Possessed Man

- A. What were demons?
 - 1. I wish I could emphatically answer that question, but I can't.
 - 2. Therefore, any dogmatic speculation is unprofitable (2 Cor. 4:6).
- B. What I can tell you is that Jesus demonstrated his absolute power over them.
- C. Look at what these demons took from this man.
 - 1. He was abandoned (Mark 5:4).
 - 2. He lost his sense of shame (Luke 8:27).
 - 3. He harmed himself (Mark 5:5).

II. The Heartlessness of the Gadarenes

- A. They were more concerned about the loss of the pigs than the reclaiming of this man!
- B. They pleaded with Jesus to leave their region (Mark 5:18).
- C. There were no expressions of gratitude, no thanks, no praising of God just pleading with him to leave!

III. The Gratitude of the Delivered Man

- A. He begged Jesus to take him with him (Mark 5:18).
- B. Though denied permission, he was given another task to spread the news of his deliverance throughout all Decapolis, a larger region than just Gadara (Mark 5:19).

- 3. Are you the person who find more important things in life than Jesus?
- 4. Are you the person who has been delivered by Jesus and just can't stop telling others your good news?
