## Not Him, The Other Guy

Eleazar and Ithamar

(Leviticus 10:1-20)

- Introduction: 1. Who were the two sons of Aaron, who were priests, and we read about them making a mistake in Leviticus 10?
  - 2. In answer to this question, nearly everyone would surely say, "Nadab and Abihu," but I'm not talking about them, but the other guys, "Eleazar and Ithamar."
  - 3. We don't give these two men much attention, but I think we make a mistake when we don't.
  - 4. Ills. Of blind men who went to the zoo.
  - 5. All four of these sons tell us something about God, and when we only look at Nadab and Abihu, we may come away with a distorted picture of God.

## I. Nadab & Abihu

- A. (Leviticus 10:1-11).
- B. "Strange" Fire (zarah Heb. Phonetic zoor) To turn aside, unauthorized.
  - 1. (Exodus 30:9; Leviticus 16:12).
  - 2. The fire was to come from the altar of burnt offerings.
- C. "Which he had not commanded them" (Leviticus 10:1).
  - 1. The silence of the Scriptures.
    - 2. Is it permissive or prohibitive?
      - a. (Leviticus 10:1).
      - b. (Jeremiah 32:35).
      - c. (Hebrews 7:14).
      - d. (Hebrews 1:5).
- D. Our censors are often flaming with strange fire!
  - 1. Just think of the things that are offered up to God that are unauthorized today!
  - 2. Such presumptuous actions demonstrate a lack of respect for God's holiness (Leviticus 10:3; Ps. 36:1; Romans 3:18; Jeremiah 2:19).
- **E.** Additional error suggested (Leviticus 10:9).

## II. Eleazar & Ithamar

- A. (Leviticus 10:12-20).
- B. The two other sons of Aaron that we usually overlook.
- C. They too, made a mistake in their obedience to God (Leviticus 10:16-20), yet with very different outcomes.
- D. Why the difference?
  - 1. Not all sin is the same.

- a. (John 19:11)
- b. (Matthew 12:31-32).
- c. (1 John 5:16-17).
- d. Failing to realize this difference robs a lot of people of peace and security
  - 1) Consider Paul's security (2 Tim. 1:12; 4:6-8).
  - 2) (1 John 5:16).
  - 3) Best we can sometimes muster is "I hope I'm saved."
- e. (1 Kings 15:5).
- f. There is an on-going forgiveness to one who sins while "walking in the light" (1 John 1:7).
- g. God is merciful to the humble (Micah 7:18).
- h. Ills. Of two little boys getting water for dad.
- 2. God makes distinction between sins committed by those walking in darkness and those who are walking in the light.
- Conclusion: 1. Let's not forget the lessons learned from all four of Aaron's sons.
  - 2. They give balance and a better perception of the God we serve.
