Reasons To Keep The Faith

(2 Timothy 4:6-8)

Introduction: 1. At the end of Paul's life, after many struggles and trials, he said that he had kept the faith.

- 2. But why? What motivated him to endure such hardship?
- 3. For that matter, why should we turn control of our life over to one who promises us difficulties (Matthew 10:34-39; 2 Timothy 3:12).
- 4. While there are many reasons to do so, I believe three are fundamental.
- 5. If these reasons don't motivate you to become a Christian and to keep the faith, I don't know what else I can offer you.

I. Because Of What Jesus Did On The Cross

- A. The humiliation of the cross (Philippians 2:8).
- B. The agony of the cross (Luke 22:44; Mt. 27:26-30; Isaiah 50:6; 52:14).
- C. The purpose of the cross (2 Corinthians 5:21).

II. Because Of Heaven

- A. John attempts to describe his vision of Heaven to us in Revelation 21.
- B. On reason to keep the faith is so that Heaven will be yours.
 - 1. A place of reward (Matthew 5:11-12).
 - 2. A place of reunion (2 Samuel 12:23).
 - 3. Because of the things present (1 Peter 1:4; Revelation 21:3; Hebrews 12:22-23).
 - 4. Because of the things absent (Revelation 21:4, 27).

III. Because Of Hell

- A. (2 Corinthians 5:11) Hell has been diminished, ignored, and all but eliminated today.
- B. Ills. Jonathan Edwards and "Sinners In The Hands Of An Angry God."
- C. Hell is:
 - 1. The wrath of God (Hebrews 10:29-31; Proverbs 20:2).
 - 2. Eternal (Matthew 25:46).
 - 3. A place of fire (Revelation 20:15).
 - 4. A place of no relief (Revelation 14:11).
 - 5. A place of no hope.
