# This Is the Will of God

(Ephesians 5:17)

# Introduction: 1. Ills. – When in school, I always loved teachers who would say, "You better remember this. You will see this again on the test."

- 2. Someday, we are going to be tested (John 12:48).
- 3. Part of the good news is that God explicitly told us some of the answers.
- 4. In several New Testament passages, the Holy Spirit guided Bible writers to declare, "This is the will of God..."
- 5. In this lesson, we'll look at some of those statements and make sure we're preparing for our "test" as we should be.

# I. This is the Will of God: Our Sanctification

- A. (1 Thessalonians 4:3).
- B. It's difficult for people to stay sexually pure in our hyper-sexualized culture.
- C. However, it is possible (Genesis 19:8).
- D. God's commands are not grievous (1 John 5:3).

# II. This is the Will of God: To Give Thanks

- A. (1 Thessalonians 5:18).
- B. (Philippians 4:6).
- C. We are the recipients of so many of God's blessings, many we don't even realize.

### III. This is the Will of God: Don't Be Conformed to the World

- A. (Romans 12:2).
- B. If we are like the world, how can we be the light we need to be (Matthew 5:16)?
- **C.** Did the "world" 50 years ago have higher morals than the church today?

### IV. This is the Will of God: Hope is Only in Jesus

- A. (Colossians 1:27).
- B. God revealed this good news to us and without it, we would be hopeless.
- C. We need to be in Jesus (1 Timothy 3:12) and Jesus needs to be in us (Colossians 1:27).

### V. This is the Will of God: Obey the Laws of the Land

- A. (1 Peter 2:13-15).
- B. Of course, there is an exception (Acts 5:29).
- C. Rebellion is the course of our culture today...but not for a child of God.
- Conclusion: 1. As we began, we noted that someday we will have a test.
  - 2. We'll have no excuse if we miss these items, because God explicitly told us he wanted us to know these answers.
