- B. Many today try to make something sexual about David and Jonathan's relationship (1 Samuel 1:26).

 - 1. "Does it startle you for me to suggest there might be positive images of homosexuality in the Bible?" (p. 55).
 - a. David and Jonathan.
 - b. Ruth and Naomi.

 - 2. You have to develop a "hermeneutic of suspicion" (p. 66) and read passages through "queer colored glasses" (p. 61).

- A. Through Similar Attitudes
 - 1. They were not jealous of each other or for what belonged to each other.
 - a. David and Saul (1 Samuel 24:1-5).
 - b. Jonathan and David (1 Samuel 23:17).
 - 2. They were both "all in" for God.
 - a. David and Goliath (1 Samuel 17:29,32).
 - b. Jonathan and the Philistines (1 Samuel 14:6-14).
- B. Through Similar Actions
 - 1. Jonathan took action to warn David (1 Samuel 20).
 - 2. David and Mephibosheth (2 Samuel 9).

III. Why We Need Friends

- A. A friend can be closer than a brother (Proverbs 18:24).
 - 1. Blood is thicker than water...or should water (baptism) be thicker than blood?
- B. In friends, we find strength when we are weak (Ecclesiastes 4:9-12; Gal. 6:2).
- C. In friends, we find good counsel (Proverbs 27:9).
- D. In friends, we are made better (Proverbs 27:17).
- E. In friends, we are held accountable (Proverbs 27:6).

Conclusion:

- 1. If you want good friends, you must be friendly, yourself (Proverbs 18:24).
