People You Need in Your Life Who's Your Zacchaeus

(Luke 19:1-10)

- Introduction: 1. For the past several weeks, we have been examining people we need in our lives.
 - 2. (Ecclesiastes 4:9-12) We do need people.
 - 3. This morning's lesson examines a person we need in our life, but maybe don't want We need a Zacchaeus.

I. Who Was Zacchaeus

- A. Zacchaeus was a tax collector (Matthew 5:47; 18:15-18).
- B. Because of his job, he had to be a social outcast.
- C. Not only did Zacchaeus have a job that people thought was contemptuous, but he also would have been an easy target for verbal abuse because of his short stature.
- D. In spite of his social and physical limitations, Jesus reached out to him.

II. Lessons We Can Learn From A Zacchaeus

- A. Zacchaeus teaches us to look past the superficial.
 - 1. Do we judge people by the way they dress, or by the way they look?
 - 2. (James 2:1-9).
- B. Zacchaeus teaches us compassion.
 - 1. No less than 12 times does the text tell us that Jesus was "moved with compassion."
 - 2. How are we affected by people who need our compassion?
 - 3. How do we treat "fifth wheels," "social misfits," "loners," "the mentally ill," and the "physically handicapped?"
 - 4. Do you run from these people?
- C. Zacchaeus reminds us of the value of a soul.
 - 1. (Matthew 16:26)
 - 2. (Luke 15:4,7).
 - 3. (Mark 2:17).
- E. Zacchaeus give us an opportunity to be like Jesus.
 - 1. (Romans 8:29).
 - 2. (Matthew 10:25).
 - 3. (Galatians 2:20).
 - 4. "Oh To Be Like Thee."

Conclusion: 1. You need a Zacchaeus in your life.

- 2. Our relationships should not just be one-sided. Sometimes, instead of "getting," we need to "give."
- 3. Who's your Zaccheus? You need one to become more like Jesus.
