(Matthew 19:16-22; Mark 10:17-22)

Introduction: 1. Have you ever known of anyone who seemed to have everything, but threw it all away by poor decisions?

- 2. This is the case with tonight's text.
- 3. A rich, young, ruler, who was wanting to know what to do to inherit eternal life, had an encounter with Jesus that didn't end up the way anyone would have hoped.
- 4. Let's examine his encounter.

I. The Rich, Young, Ruler Came to the Right Person

- A. (Matthew 19:16).
- B. Where do you go for an answer to questions?
- C. As you know, there are many voices, not all of them are worthy to believe.
- D. (2 Kings 5:1-7, 1 John 4:1; 1 Timothy 4:1-2).
- E. Jesus was a proven, attested, man of God (Acts 2:22).

II. The Rich, Young, Ruler Asked the Right Question

- A. (Matthew 19:16,18,20).
- B. What greater questions can be asked than those dealing with eternal life?
- C. Some people make asking questions a trivial game (2 Timothy 3:7).

III. The Rich, Young, Ruler Received the Right Answer

- A. (Matthew 19:18-21).
- B. Jesus gave the right answer (1 Peter 2:22).
- C. (John 6:28-29).

IV. The Rich, Young, Ruler Made the Wrong Decision

- A. (Matthew 19:22).
- B. He loved his riches more than he desired eternal life.
- C. (Matthew 16:26).

Conclusion: 1. What a tragedy that has been replayed over and over again in the lives of countless people.

- 2. Everyone wants to be saved, few want to make Jesus Lord of their lives.
- 3. What about you? Are you willing to give up your most prized possession or most valued part of your life in order to be a disciple of Jesus?
- 4. This question will separate the curious would-be disciples of Jesus from the committed disciples of Jesus.
