(Luke 4:14-30)

- Introduction:
1. “Why did my Savior come to earth?”
  2. That’s an excellent question, to which we have a compelling answer.
  3. In this lesson, I want us to examine the mission of Jesus as set forth in the fourth chapter of Luke.

### I. To Reveal God’s Word

- A. (Luke 4:14-17).
- B. Jesus is traveling and teaching in synagogues.
- C. Eventually, he came to the town of Nazareth, where he was raised.
- D. Jesus taught unlike other rabbis; he taught with authority (Mark 1:22).
- E. What about you? Are you revealing God’s word to others?

### II. To Proclaim God’s Grace

- A. (Luke 4:18-19).
- B. (Isaiah 61:1-2).
- C. Jesus brought good news to all who were in need.
- D. What about you? Are you telling others of God’s grace?

### III. To Bring God’s Salvation

- A. (Luke 4:22-27).
- B. They all spoke well of him, but they questioned.
- C. “Yes, but...”
- D. When people reject God’s word, he looks elsewhere.
- E. What about you? While we can’t bring God’s salvation in the same way Jesus did, are we bringing people to Jesus who can save them?

### IV. To Expose Our Hearts

- A. (Luke 4:28-30).
- B. They were angry at the good news of Jesus and tried to kill him.
- C. Every time the word of God is preached, it elicits a response.
- D. What about you? What kind of heart do you have?

- Conclusion:
1. We should be so thankful and indebted to Jesus for his mission that he faithfully fulfilled.
  2. May we respond to our indebtedness by renewing our mission to be more like Jesus.
