What Did Jesus Say About... "Abortion"

(Exodus 21:22-25)

Introduction: 1.

- 1. On January 22, 1973, the United States Supreme Court ruled that having an abortion was a woman's constitutional right.
- 2. Two weeks ago, 49 years after the Roe v Wade decision, our United States Supreme Court overturned that ruling and returned this issue back to the states to decide.
- 3. However, during the convening 49 years, our nation has killed approximately 63 million babies.
 - a. That number is hard to grasp.
 - b. That's sill 1 million more than the populations of KY, TN, SC, FL, GA, AL, MS, LA.
- 4. The practice of abortion has been our national shame for half a century.
- 5. In this lesson, we want to examine what the Bible says about abortion.

I. Disclaimers

- A. What did Jesus say about abortion?
 - 1. He never specifically addressed this topic.
 - 2. But that doesn't mean he didn't address it in principle.
 - 3. Plus, Jesus is truth (John 14:6; John 16:12-15).
- B. I'm "Mansplaining" abortion.
 - 1. Mansplaining When a man explains something to a woman in a manner regarded as condescending or patronizing.
 - 2. Some take great offense for a man to speak about abortion because it concerns a woman's body.
 - 3. But it doesn't matter whether a man, woman, or child speaks what the Bible says, it is truth and needs to be heeded.
- C. It's been said we need to "tread lightly" when talking about this.
 - 1. Would we say the same about the holocaust of Nazi Germany?
 - 2. Abortion has been our national holocaust!
 - 3. Soft, cajoling speech in inappropriate in the face of what has occurred.
- D. You're preaching to the choir.
 - 1. If you think abortion isn't the secret sin of countless Christians, you are mistaken.
 - 2. In 2015, Lifeway Research did a poll and learned that 70% of abortions in the U.S. were by women who professed faith in Jesus.
 - 3. In fact, you might say that the abortion problem would almost be solved if people in the pews lived out God's word.

II. The Sanctity of Life

- A. God values the pre-born.
 - 1. (Psalm 139:13-16).
 - a. God is involved in the formation of a baby in the womb.
 - b. Can we so lightly regard "the work of God's hand" as valueless?
 - c. No! The pre-born baby is a remarkable work of God that compels us to stand in awe of his wisdom and power.
 - 2. (Luke 1:41-42).
 - a. What Elizabeth said was prompted by the Holy Spirit.
 - b. "Blessed" "eulogeo" speak well of, praise, extol.
 - c. How could one affirm that what God says is to be praised and extoled has no value?
- B. God values the pre-born life the same as life out of the womb.
 - 1. (Exodus 21:22-24).
 - 2. If a man causes a woman to give birth prematurely...
 - a. He will be fined in no harm follows.
 - b. But if harm follows, (i.e. the baby dies), it shall be a life for a life.

Conclusion:

- 1. God hates the hands of those who shed innocent blood (Proverbs 6:17).
- 2. I can't think of any blood that is more innocent than that of an infant child in the womb of his mother.
- 3. However, as is the case with any denunciation of sin, there is good news!
- 4. "Where sin abounded, grace abounded much more" (Romans 5:20).
